

Assets of Lynn

According to a City of Lynn Survey: 906 people who responded in three different languages.

When asked "What do you love about Lynn?", there were some clear favorites.

- Natural Resources (423 respondents) Lynn Woods, the waterfront and beach, green spaces and Gannon Golf Course were all beloved resources.
- **Diversity (361)** 40% of respondents mentioned Lynn's diversity as a strength in their response.
- **People & Community (201)** This category includes respondents who spoke about their social networks in Lynn, about the general inclusiveness and friendliness of Lynners, and the pride people feel in community. Another recurring theme, cited specifically by 29 respondents, was the sense that Lynners take care of each other in times of need.
- **Convenience and Location (154)** Lynn's proximity to the North Shore and Boston were commonly cited as assets.
- Arts, Culture & History (152) Whether it was the historic architecture, music scene, or murals, many respondents cited Lynn's cultural assets as something they loved.
- **Business and Restaurants (115)** The unique businesses and particularly the food scene were often-cited favorites.



Compared to the region, Lynn has slightly more people under 20, and slightly fewer people 65 and older, but overall the age structure is typical.



Languages Spoken

- home, though issues with Census Bureau survey results suggest the proportion of English speakers is likely less than this.
- Spanish is the next most popular primary language. While an estimated 37% of Lynners (32,000) speak Spanish at home, over half of LPS students (53%) speak Spanish.
- Other languages spoken in Lynn include Khmer, Hatian Creole, Arabic, Portuguese, and Vietnamese.



Share of Employment for Select Industries, Lynn Workers vs Residents



The industries Lynners work in don't align with jobs in Lynn.

While 18% of Lynn jobs were in manufacturing in 2018, only 8% of Lynn residents work in the industry. A similar gap exists for health care.

More Lynn residents are in retail trade, accommodation and food services, and professional services than the jobs Lynn offers.
